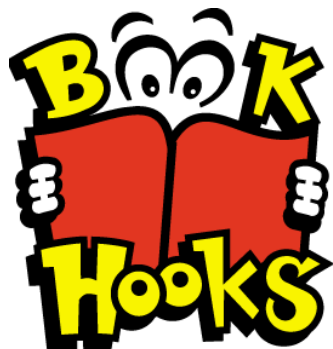


Reading Strategies for Parents & Kids

- 1. Sense and Structure**
 - Does it make sense?
 - Does it sound right
- 2. Predict**
 - Make a good guess
- 3. Skip It and Read On**
 - Read on and come back.
- 4. Skip It**
 - Could you leave the word out?
- 5. Re Run**
 - Go back to the start of the sentence and try it again.
- 6. Substitute**
 - Put in a word that makes sense.
- 7. Picture Clues**
 - Can the picture help you?
- 8. Identify**
 - Where else have you seen that word?
- 9. Sound it Out**
 - What's the letter? The Sound?
- 10. Ask someone!**
